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# MS 0101 CAMP BRODIE Papers, 1905

## **DESCRIPTION**

Payroll forms and special orders associated with 1905 military encampment of the Arizona National Guard at Camp Brodie, Arizona from August 1 to August 12. Payrolls include the Headquarters element and four line units (Companies B, H, and I along with Troop F) of the First Arizona Regiment. Two special orders (#8 and 10) also provide information on transportation and movement of troops and equipment. The payroll forms provide an accurate indication of the unit strength at the time of the encampment. The names of Colonel McClintock (Regiment Commander) and Captain Tuthill (F Troop Commander and future commander of the Arizona National Guard) are present.

#### **HISTORICAL NOTE**

The payroll records of a portion of the First Infantry Regiment of the Arizona National Guard provide information on early activities of the state militia. Yearly encampments were initiated soon after the turn of the century and attempted to bring together all state units of the Guard at one location. Partial federal funding for these activities was added with the passage of the 1903 Dick Act by the U.S. Congress. The payroll forms indicate the portion of the encampment pay provided by the Federal government.
