**BIOGRAPHICAL:** All that is known of Jose del Castillo is that he was an attorney in Tucson. His writings were prepared for <u>Arizona, A State Guide</u>, published by the Work Projects Administration. Many of the manuscripts in this collection were not used in the book.

**SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTES**: This collection consists of three series: (1) Manuscripts, ca. 1935-1940; (2) Correspondence, 1936-1939; (3) Miscellany, ca. 1935-1940.

Series One, Manuscripts, ca. 1935-1940, include works on the history of Tucson, Pima County, and Arizona, transportation in Arizona and local folklore. This series includes interviews with, and biographical information on the following individuals; Ruben M. Series Two, Correspondence, 1936-1939, consists of memoranda and correspondence regarding the Federal Writers' Project and several of Castillo's assignments for the project.

Series Three, Miscellany, ca. 1935-1940, includes <u>The American Guide Manual</u> and other printed matter describing the Federal Writers' Project; sketches by Ross Santee; bibliographies; unidentified research notes; and articles of incorporation of the Better Home Investment and Trust Company incorporated by Jose del Castillo, J.J. Benton, and Ralph Langworth.
