DESCRIPTION

Facsimiles reproductions of four codices (Cuetlexohuapan, Tlatelolco, Yanhuitán and Mapa Quinatzin). The facsimiles were originally created for use in an exhibit by Roberto Cuetara Gonzales. The codices are 1/Codice de Yanhuitlan (2 pages unfolded as in a book), 2/Mapa Quintzin, 3/Codice Cuetlaxcohuapan, 4/Codice de Tlatelolco, Bench (Banquieta) of the Temple of the Eagle Warriors.

HISTORICAL NOTE

The Aztecs and other Native people of Mexico had a complex, non-linear writing style. Their ancient documents of Pre-Conquest Mesoamerican manuscripts are colloquially called codices. Documents in the native tradition continued to be produced throughout the sixteenth century.
