Hart, Samuel Lombard, 1830-1893
Papers, 1844-1881

DESCRIPTION

Papers include family correspondence dating from 1844 including letters written by Hart to his wife (in Wisconsin) from San Francisco, San Bernardino and Tombstone. Only the two letters from Tombstone (May 1880) are Arizona related materials. The letters do describe conditions in Tombstone and Lombard's efforts to get his business established. Also included are U. S. Army special orders, enlistment literature and passes during the Civil War. A number of essays written by Hart cover such subjects as "Temperance," Procrastination," and "The Indian."

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Samuel Lombard Hart was born in New York in 1830. During the Civil War, he was Commissioned as 2nd Lt. Company C, 10th regiment Wisconsin Voluntary Infantry. He mustered out of the army at Camp Washburn, Menasha, Wisconsin in 1864. He was a gunsmith and moved to Tombstone, Arizona in 1880, where he operated a gunshop. He moved from Tombstone to Tucson in 1890 and died in 1893.

The bulk of the collection was donated by Mrs. S. L. Hart, ca. 1930; some photocopied items were donated by Alfred Atterbury in 1993.
