This collection includes manuscripts and correspondence by Jess Hayes. The first folder contains the complete manuscript for his book "Apache Vengeance." The second folder has correspondence about the book, as well as a short biography of Mr. Hayes. The third folder has two of his unpublished manuscripts: "Arizona Rebel: Life and Exploits of G. H. Oury" and "Were These Young Girls Really Murdered?" about the death of Myrtle and Lou Goswick in Globe in 1911. The final folder contains miscellaneous correspondence and newspaper clippings of his death.

**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Jesse Gilmore Hayes was born on August 25, 1901 in Globe, Arizona. He married Vivian Green in Phoenix on July 15, 1924 and they had four children together. Hayes taught in the Globe schools from 1928-1940. In 1940, he was elected Gila County School Superintendent and served continuously until 1968. He died on August 6, 1968 after giving a speech for his re-election.
