DESCRIPTION

The collection consists of the corporate records of the Cochise (Arizona) Lodge #5 of the Independent Order of the Odd Fellows (IOOF). Founded in Tombstone in 1881, the Lodge records include minutes, secretarial and treasurer reports, applications for membership, correspondence with other Arizona IOOF lodges and correspondence with lodges throughout the United States. The bulk of the material is from 1883 to 1900.

HISTORICAL NOTE

The Independent Order of the Odd Fellows (IOOF) was established to give aid to those in need and to pursue beneficial acts and projects. This desire to aid and improve his fellow man was symbolized by three links which stand for Friendship, Love and Truth. The IOOF was founded in England in the 17th Century, and in 1819 the Sovereign Grand Lodge in the United States was founded in Baltimore, Maryland. IOOF members were allowed to self-charter lodges in new towns and cities, with the charter being later approved by the Sovereign Grand Lodge.

On August 9, 1881, Cochise Lodge #5 of the IOOF was founded in Tombstone, Arizona Territory by six men: Charles E. Fredericks, Bart Callaghan, R.J. Pryke, Daniel Drew, Michael Griffin, and H.H. Tuttle. Cochise Lodge #5 joined with the other Arizona lodges in 1884 to found the Sovereign Grand Lodge of Arizona. By 1890 Cochise Lodge #5 had 78 members, and it continued to grow into the early 1900s, when it began a slow decline. In the 1930s and the 1940s the Secretary for the Lodge was Ray Krebs, former Mayor of Tombstone, and he seems to have kept much of the material. The Lodge appears to have become defunct sometime in the 1960s.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The records of the Cochise Lodge #5 of the IOOF cover a broad range of time, from 1881 to 1957, and have been divided in four series: Organizational Records, Correspondence, Printed Material, and Ledgers. The majority of the material dates prior to 1900. The organizational records include membership applications, minutes, reports to the Arizona Grand Secretary, and resolutions and amendments to the by-laws. The membership applications are interesting in that they provide a person's occupation, their age and place of birth. Most of the applications are from 1900 to 1918.

The majority of the records consist of correspondence from members of the Cochise Lodge and from other lodges in and outside of Arizona. Much of the correspondence from members relates to dues and payment of dues. The correspondence from other lodges concerns dismissal of members for non-payment of dues, monies owed for care of sick brothers, monies owed for burials, and some discussion of by-laws and encampments. Also in the correspondence are certificates, called *Visitation* and *Withdrawal*, that act as letters of introduction. The visitation certificates enabled an Odd Fellow to visit, seek aid, and borrow monies from other Lodges while traveling. On the back of the visitation certificate the lodges that were visited are recorded. The withdrawal certificates enabled IOOF members leaving a lodge to join a new lodge in another city or town.

The printed material from this collection consists of advertisements for products related to fraternal organizations. There are two regalia catalogues that would provide a researcher with details for pre-1900 vestments, standards, pins, ledgers, etc. The ledgers consist largely of dues receipts and check registers. One ledger relates to the mission of the IOOF. It records relief given to sick brothers, for such illnesses as rheumatism.
