BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

George Wharton James was a prolific writer and lecturer writing over 40 books in addition to many articles and lecturers on California, the American Southwest, and Native Americans. He was born in Lincolnshire, England and came to the United States in 1881 as a Methodist minister. In 1889 he left the church and began work as a journalist and lecturer. Some of his books that deal with the Southwest include *Arizona the Wonderland, Grand Canyon of Arizona*, and *New Mexico, the Land of the Delight Makers*.
