**Jeffords, Thomas Jefferson, 1832-1914
Papers, 1883-1888**

DESCRIPTION

Small collection of primarily legal documents dealing with a case of larceny in 1884. The case "J. C. Handy vs. T. J. Jeffords, et al" involved removing machinery from the Yankee Smelter near Harshaw. P. J. McNamee acted as agent for Dr. Handy. Includes correspondence with from Colin Cameron to Dr. John Handy, 1884 advising him to act in the matter. Most of the papers are actually about John Jeffords, Thomas' brother but there is one letter from Thomas Jeffords to Colin Cameron written from Fort Huachuca in 1883.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Thomas Jeffords, Indian agent at Fort Bowie was remembered as the "blood brother" of Cochise. He was born in New York in 1832 and came to Arizona in 1860. He died at Owl Head in Pinal County in 1914.
