DESCRIPTION

The bulk of the collection consists of one letterbook kept by Morris Hunter Jones as immigration inspector in charge of Chinese and Japanese immigration at Naco and Nogales. Much of Jones' correspondence is addressed to George Webb, Inspector in charge at Tucson concerning the manner in which Jones handled his cases. The collection also contains biographical information written by Jones' son, M. H. Jones concerning the role of U. S. marshals and Arizona Rangers in border patrol work, the Mexican Revolution in 1914 and boyhood in Bisbee, Arizona. One photograph of a baby boy, presumably of M. H. Jones is also included.

Morris Hunter Jones moved to Naco, A. T. from Washington, D. C. in 1906 to work as Chinese inspector for the U. S. Department of Commerce and Labor Service under provisions of the Chinese Exclusion Act. He was transferred to Big Spring, Texas.
