BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:

George Roskruge Kitt was the son of Edith Stratton Kitt and George F. Kitt. He was born in Tucson in 1906 and graduated from the University of Arizona in 1929. He took a job with Union Oil Co. in California and later trained pilots for World War II and the Lodwick School of Aeronautics in Florida. Much of the correspondence to his parents is written from Florida. During this time, he helped coordinate Howard Hughes record-breaking flight around the world in 1938. He married Marie Eloise Galvin in 1953 while living in Washington, D.C. He died in 1984.

SCOPE AND CONTENT: This is a small collection of biographical material concerning George R. Kitt. There are four folders in the collection; the first contains only George Farwell Kitt's (his father) passport, the second and third are letters from George to his parents, 1934-1945, and one folder is of his genealogy.
