Biographical Note

Andrew ("Andy") Matson was born in Vamhus, Sweden, March 1, 1888. He arrived at Bellemont, Arizona, near Flagstaff in 1903, where he worked in the lumber industry. Matson was first elected to the Coconino County Board of Supervisors in 1938. He served on the Board until 1950, when he was elected to the Arizona House of Representatives. He was known for his support of Northern Arizona University as well as his efforts to establish the route of U.S. Highway #180 along the western base of the San Francisco Peaks. He died in Phoenix, Arizona in 1975.

Scope and Content Note

The collection volume is .5 linear ft. The materials are mostly correspondence and related documents from Andrew Matson's career as Chairman of the Coconino County Board of Supervisors.
