MS 1124 MAXEY, FLYNN M., d. 1973 Papers, 1856-1975

DESCRIPTION

Family collection of papers from Flynn Maxey, his wife Olivia Meyer Maxey (1901-1979) and papers of Olivia's grandfather, Charles Herman Meyer (1829-1903), who was justice of the peace in Tucson from 1863 to the late 1890s. Olivia Maxey's papers are concerning renaming Meyer Street, which had originally been named for her grandfather. The papers of Charles Meyer were papers in his official capacity as Justice of the Peace. Also present is once folder with an application for the Knights of Pythias by Francis Henry Goodwin in 1886 as well as his death notice in 1892. Of unknown provenance is one agreement between Fritz Einzau and A. B. Chapman concerning cultivation of fields at Tumacacori in 1856.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Charles Herman Meyer (1829-1903) was a druggist and justice of the Peace in Pima County for approximately 30 years in the late 1800s. His granddaughter Olivia was born in Tucson in 1901. She married Flynn M. Maxey, a member of the State Liquor Board who managed Steinfeld's Liquor Dept. for twenty-five years before retiring in 1967.
