BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: Mildred Taitt was born in Gouverneur, N.Y. to Lucretia Barnes and George Taitt, a college professor, on February 21, 1879. She taught science in New York City schools until 1918, when she moved to Tucson for her health, where she took some classes at the University of Arizona. She took a vacation with friends during Christmas break to the Tohono O'odham and met her future husband, Jefferson Milton, the Chief U.S. immigration inspector for Arizona. They married on June 30, 1919 and moved to a desert camp. They quickly were relocated to Fairbank, and eventually retired to Tombstone. They moved to Tucson in 1941 and Jefferson died in 1947. Mildred moved to a Phoenix nursing home in 1957, where she lived until her death in September 1963.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE: This collection consists of correspondence from Mildred Taitt Milton between 1918-1919, and photographs of Mildred and Jefferson Milton from ca. 1919-1930s. Also included are a few letters from before and after the bulk period, photographs of Mildred Taitt as a child and young woman in New York, and photographs from a visit to Mexico in the 1920s. There is one binder of immigration correspondence and documents from Jefferson Milton encompassing the years 1906-1911 discussing expenses of the department and individual immigration and deportation cases. There is also a book, *Manual of Christian Life*, and a notebook of Mildred's notes on her thesis.
