HISTORICAL NOTE

Henry A. Morgan was born in Columbia, Ca. October 1, 1861 and came to Arizona in 1880. He became Justice of the Peace at Fort Grant military post and spent 4 years as postmaster there. In 1886 he married Anne Belle Dixon at Tucson. Governor Brodie appointed him member of the Arizona Territorial Board of Equalization in 1895. Later he organized the Norton and Morgan Commercial Company at Wilcox, Az. In 1910 he was elected president of the Wilcox Bank and Trust Company and in 1927 he was named register for the U.S. Land Office in Phoenix, Az. From 1936-1937 he served as magistrate of Phoenix, Az.

Morgan was prominent in Masonic and Shrine activities and was a past grand master of Arizona Grand Lodge and leader of other Masonic groups. He was an active member of the advisory board of the Salvation Army and member of the Royal Order of Jesters. Morgan died in 1942.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Henry A. Morgan Collection consists of his personal and business papers as well as materials from Masonic and other organizations he was associated with. Correspondence includes incoming and outgoing copies of material from 1914 to 1943. Four folders contain materials associated with Masonic activities, including correspondence, announcements, draft addresses by Morgan and some references to rituals. Photos associated with the collection consist of photos and postcards of scenes around Wilcox, Az., including the grammar school, and the commercial store owned by Morgan. Photo highlights include black and white post cards showing cowboys working cattle, branding and eating around the chuck wagon. Significant interests for the manuscripts include the large collection of witty sayings, poems, jokes and stories collected by Morgan. Many of these items Morgan probably used with addresses to the local organizations he belonged to.
