Dr. Patrick Lukens is Professor of History and Political Science at Eastern Arizona College. He has lived his entire life in three of the 4-corners states (Colorado, New Mexico and Arizona). Patrick earned his BA in History and MA in Public History at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces and his PhD in History (with concentrations in US/Mexican foreign relations, US/Mexican Borderlands, Mexican American ethnic history, Latin American History and US Public Policy/Political History) at Arizona State University in Tempe. After completing his PhD, he worked in a one year post-doctoral internship as a policy analyst for the Arizona Board of Regents, then moved on to Eastern Arizona College in 2000. Since 2012, he has also been an adjunct faculty member in the ASU @ The Gila Valley program (a partnership between Arizona State University and Eastern Arizona College).

Patrick is the author of *A Quiet Victory for Latino Rights: FDR and the controversy over "Whiteness"* published by the University of Arizona Press, and has been an invited book reviewer for *The American Historical Review*.
