Chandler Teacher Nominated for the MacGregor Teaching Award *National Teaching Award Given Through National History Day Competition*

PHOENIX, AZ — The Arizona Historical Society congratulates Mr. Dave Carras, a teacher at Kyrene de la Mirada in Chandler, Arizona who was nominated for the Hannah E. (Liz) MacGregor Teacher of the Year History Teacher Award. The MacGregor Teacher of the Year award is sponsored by James F. Harris in honor of his sister and is awarded to one middle and one high school teacher annually.

Each of the 57 National History Day affiliates may nominate one middle and high school teacher each for this award. Mr. Carras is the junior division nominee from Arizona. The two \$5,000 awards are presented to teachers who demonstrate a commitment to engaging students in historical learning through innovative use of primary sources, implementation of active learning strategies to foster historical thinking skills, and participation in the National History Day Contest.
