HISTORICAL NOTE

Laura Danieli was born a twin on May 4, 1915 in New York City, where she grew up in a 'Bohemian' family of her mother and father, immigrants from Italy, and their seven girls. The Danieli family did not have a lot of money but did have "lots of fun and always a houseful of guests", Laura was quoted as saying. These guests included notables such as New York judges, Mayor La Guardia, one of their closest family friends and [the inventor and physicist?] Marconi, as well as hundreds of newly-arrived Italian immigrants who became citizens due to Mr. Danieli's help and coaching for citizenship examinations. Laura graduated from P.S. 168 in 6½ years, then graduated from Julia Richman High School, New York in 3½ years, entering college at 16. She studied the sciences at Columbia University and New York University, excelling in math. She graduated with a B.A. in June 1937. She then worked as a credit clerk for a department store, and a bookkeeper for a produce firm, where she met her husband George (Ciccolella) whom she married in 1939.

The couple kept Laura's last name and they became co-owners of F. Danieli Wholesale Tobacco Company, which they built from a small business to a large, successful enterprise, working 16-18 hour days. In 1948 they met their retirement goal and moved to Phoenix after taking a trip West to see where they might retire away from the city. The people they met in Phoenix won them over from their California destinations such as San Diego and Santa Monica. According to Laura, "All the wonderful things in life happened since we came here [to Phoenix]. I am a person, not a number". She started graduate school at Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona, where she considered becoming a teacher and taught for a year at Machan Elementary School in 1949.

Laura left graduate school after becoming pregnant with her only child, Gay Rita Danieli (Sutherland), who was born May 23, 1950. Laura decided to become 'just a housewife' while her husband worked in real estate investing. But soon after Gay was born, Laura, who always loved the theatre, got involved with the community's The Phoenix Little Theatre for ten years. Bringing her baby daughter with her, she became involved in all behind the scenes action (plus at least one stage appearance) and was responsible for its running very healthfully in the black, coming up with such successful development strategies as block ticket sales. She became vice-president of the Board in 1956, the same year she won its "Best Trooper" award.

She also became passionately involved with the Salvation Army in Phoenix, as cofounder of the Women's Auxiliary in and sponsor of others in Mesa and Sun City, AZ and Las Vegas. She served 19 years on the Advisory Board of the Salvation Army, founded and chaired the Gadget and Gizmo Sale, a successful fundraiser and personally drove needy children to a Salvation Army summer camp, Camp O'Wood in southern Arizona, a weekly, daylong trip. For her dedicated service, she was awarded the Salvation Army's first "Sally Award" in 1963 and was inducted into the Order of Distinguished Auxiliary Service, the highest honor the Salvation Army bestows on any volunteer worldwide, in 1978.

In 1956 she became secretary of the Phoenix Executive Club, a monthly dinner club started in the early 1950s that brought nationally and internationally known speakers to Phoenix and by 1959 she had become its Executive Director, becoming Director Emeritus after 1976. The club membership was originally men of prominent status, who were sponsored by members for admission to the club, and their wives. Laura maintained a personal correspondence with several luminaries, such as Dr. Murray Banks and Bennett Cerf, publisher at Random House and TV sports personality Joe Garagolia. She was also a close friend with Erma Bombeck. The club was driven by her outstanding organizational ability and Laura was able to get speakers who rarely gave engagements through her well-known outgoing and attentive personality. The Phoenix Executive Club, perhaps suffering from Laura's leadership absence and becoming an idea whose time had passed, folded in 1980.

A feature article on Laura Danieli in the magazine <u>Arizona Living</u> named her "The Busiest Woman in Town" who only slept about four hours a night. She was frequently consulted for help in conducting civic events and fundraising. Projects she was involved in included: Civic Salute to Astronaut Frank Borman, Phoenix Centennial Celebration, Governor's Conference on Arizona Beauty, and Arts Council Resource Chairman and the Save Camelback Committee. In 1972-1973 she wrote a newspaper column, "Happy Talk" in the publication <u>Arizona Weekly</u>.

Laura Danieli did receive much recognition for her civic contributions to Phoenix. In addition to her prestigious Salvation Army and Phoenix Little Theatre awards, she was included in Who is Who in Arizona in 1958, received a Citation of Merit from the Governor of Arizona in 1965 and earned the title Very Outstanding Phoenician from the Mayor of Phoenix in 1967. Also that year, the Phoenix Advertising Club named Laura Danieli Woman of the Year for 1966 along with Man of the Year Frank Snell, prominent Phoenix attorney and civic leader. She was also included in the publication Outstanding Civic Leaders of America for 1967, became the first female life member of the Phoenix Press Club and received the first Humanitarian Award from Arizona Living magazine.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Laura Danieli collection represents not only documentation of her many personal achievements and her community service and work ethic, but gives insight to the functioning of many Phoenix civic groups because Laura Danieli provided so much of their driving force. Also, she was acquainted with and admired (and possibly imitated) by many other prominent Phoenix leaders. Danieli worked with many organizations in the city chief among these represented in this collection is the Phoenix Executives Club. In addition to the Executive Club, Danieli also found time for work with the Salvation Army Women's Auxiliary, the Phoenix Little Theatre, the Phoenix Exchange Club, and the Phoenix Press Club.

The collection has been arranged into 3 series. The first series consists mainly of Laura Danieli's scrapbooks of her civic and professional activities in Phoenix as well as

personal mementos. Drawings, newspaper clippings associated with her family are also included here. Some biographical information, family photographs, and items relating to her weekly column "Happy Talk" are also present. Series 2 contains general correspondence and dinner programs of the Phoenix Executive Club during the period Danieli was associated with it. The final series contains in depth information on the Executive Club consisting of scrapbooks and communications with anticipated speakers for the organization. Laura also maintained a speaker file for each presenter with communications, photos, seating arrangements and dinner programs. Audiotapes (both reel-to-reel and cassettes) recorded many of the guest speakers who included prominent national men and women. Ronald Reagan, Richard Nixon, Erma Bombeck, Art Linkletter, and many more came to speak. No prominent individuals from Arizona spoke to the group.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

Series 1: Laura Danieli's Civic/Personal Life

This series consists mainly of Laura Danieli's collection of scrapbooks, which she maintained by gluing or taping documents to background paper and/or sliding them into plastic sleeves and binding them in 3-ring or clamp binders. She arranged these scrapbooks by subject or type of document (such as correspondence or clippings) in addition to chronological order. For instance, there are scrapbooks on particular awards, consisting largely of the cards and laudatory letters she received, and scrapbooks on clippings of society articles and one of Arizona articles, done as a newcomer to the state. On her C.V. from 1978, she listed among her hobbies: "Collecting stories, cartoons [and] mailing humorous cards", which is represented in her scrapbooks. Many of the letters and cards she saved in her scrapbooks are from local, state and national celebrities. All binder pages have been photocopied to show the original order and layout. Newspaper articles and other highly unstable documents were copied and then the originals discarded, while other binder documents were retained. This series also contains two separate folders for photographs found in the binders, a general biographical folder, photographs from around the 1930's of Laura Danieli and her parent's family and copies and correspondence of her "Happy Talk" weekly column.

Series 2: Phoenix Executives Club – General Background

This small series contains correspondence and programs of Phoenix Executive Club. The correspondence is arranged alphabetically and covers the period 1961 through 1977. The Club's dinners always included a nationally known speaker. Executive Club programs are arranged chronologically and entail the years 1956 to 1977. Additional information about the Executive Club may be found in the Library and Archives Oral History Collection in a recorded and transcribed interview with Uta Behrens, a former member of the club in the 1970's until its demise in 1980.

Series 3: Phoenix Executives Club Speakers Files and Scrapbooks

Series 3 entails an in depth look at the Phoenix Executive Club and coordination for speakers at their banquets. For ease of research the series has been divided into 5 subseries. The first subseries consists of scrapbooks, which were arranged, basically in a chronological order entailing Club activities from 1947 to 1972. Originally the scrapbooks were in binders but have been removed to folders. A record copy of the entire binder has been maintained to show the original order. Photographs associated with specific binders and activities have been retained with the manuscript section. The second subseries houses the Club's banquet speaker files entailing the coordination, room and seating arrangements, and program for each gathering. The folders cover the period 1956 to 1978 and are arranged alphabetically by the last name of the speaker. Subseries 3 consists of reel-to-reel tapes of speaker presentations. These reels have not been reviewed since we have no player capable of handling this type of recording. Cassette tapes of speaker presentations constitute subseries 4 with tapes between 1967 and 1977. Tapes have been arranged alphabetically by last name of the speaker. The final subseries is a sign "Phoenix Executive Club."

RELATED NOTE

Two silk banners have been removed from the collection and transferred to Collections Department. These banners advertised the Phoenix Executive Club.

NOTE TO RESEARCHERS

In addition to providing information on one of the most well connected and recognized woman of Phoenix, this collection has an interesting sub-theme on women's changing role in society. Laura had a career and a family at a time when that was still unusual, and as such became a kind of prototype. Indeed, she served on a panel about issues facing working women, and the speech announcing her award as Woman of the Year made sure to mention that despite all her accomplishments, she was not one of those "driving women who forgets to be feminine." This collection, with its representation of some of the most well known personalities of the time can also illustrate national trends as reflected in Phoenix society. For example, the Gloria Steinem speaker file as well as correspondence with other Executives Club members gives some portrayal of the way she and the Feminist Movement she represented was received by Club attendees, Board Members and the local media.
