Jim currently serves as Treasurer of the Arizona Historical Society and sits on the State Board of Directors, Executive Committee, Finance Committee and Collections Committee. He is active as a volunteer in several local organizations and serves on the town council.

Jim's special interest is historical photos and documents relating to the White Mountains of Arizona. He has created digital photo presentations for local libraries and has printed and mounted old photos for local museums. He provides a free service to the community where he scans historical photos, documents and books. In addition, he maintains a private collection of several thousand files relating to the History of the White Mountains area, which are available for historical research and have been used to illustrate a book about Pinetop-Lakeside history.
