- 1. Call to Order at 6:20pm Bruce Gwynn
- 2. Call to the Public None
- 3. Approval of minutes of the September 14, 2021 meeting of the RCC Board of Directors.

- 4. President's Report Bruce Gwynn announced the appointment of Dr. David Breeckner to the position of Executive Director for the Arizona Historical Society. Bruce explained the hiring process and shared that Dr. Breeckner comes highly qualified for the position.
- 5. The annual Christmas at the Sanguinetti House Museum event was described by Bruce Gwynn. The date of December 1, 2021 was set for the event.
- 6. Bruce Gwynn shared his idea for a Christmas on Madison Avenue event in 2022.
- 7. A "Thirsty Thursday" event was also described by Bruce Gwynn and suggested this concept for consideration at the Sanguinetti House Museum.
