BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: James “Jim” Edward Ayres (1936-2015) was a historical archaeologist who focused his research on the Southwestern United States. Over the course of his career, he contributed to over 120 publications documenting the importance of Southwestern archaeological sites. He was an active participant in City of Tucson and Pima County governments, community projects and groups.

After serving in the U.S. Air Force for four years, Ayres received a BA in Anthropology from Fresno State College in 1963 and an MA in Anthropology from the University of Arizona in 1970. In 1972 James married Marianne F. (Kay) Ayres. In the earlier years of his career, Ayres directed excavations for the Tucson Urban Renewal Project (1967-1979), headed the research division at the Arizona State Museum (1978-1979), and served as Arizona State Historic Preservation Officer (1979-1981). He went on to educate future archaeologists, serving as adjunct faculty in the Department of Anthropology at Arizona State University from 1981 to 1998, and adjunct lecturer at the University of Arizona from 1999 to 2013.

Ayres served as Secretary-Treasurer of the American Society for Ethnohistory (1971-1979); President of the Arizona Archaeological and Historical Society (2004-2007); President of the Society for Historical Archaeology (1977); and Director or Advisor for the Society for Historical Archaeology, the Arizona Preservation Foundation, the Fresno County (CA) Historical Society, and the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Local service included serving as chair of the

Tucson-Pima County Historical Commission, the Arizona Governor's Archaeological Advisory Commission, member of the Pima Association of Governments Transportation Enhancement Task Force, the Southern Arizona Transportation Museum, the Old Pueblo Trolley Board of Directors, and the Arizona Historical Society State Board of Directors. Ayres received the Alene Dunlap Smith Award for Contributions to Historic Preservation, the Arizona SHPO Governor's Award for Historic Preservation, the SHA J. C. Harrington Medal for Lifetime Achievements in Historical Archaeology and Carol V. Ruppé Distinguished Service Award, the GAAC Award in Public Archaeology and the Arizona Governor's Centennial Award in Historic Preservation.

Toward the end of his life, Ayres undertook a massive project to index Tucson-area English-language newspapers published from 1870 to 1911. The index contains more than 140,000 cross-referenced entries and approximately 300 subject files. A room named in his honor is located in the Arizona Historical Society in Tucson.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE: This collection consists of 34 boxes of printed material, notes, and correspondence focused on the subjects of archaeology in the Southwest, historic site preservation, and contributions to regional Southern Arizona community and governmental projects, services and activities. Additional materials include photographs and negatives of archaeological artifacts and sites, accompanied by correspondence, notes, and reports.
