**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:** Louis Richard Caywood was an Arizona native who was born in 1906. He worked as an historical archaeologist for the National Park Service (NPS) for 24 years, between 1934 and 1969. He was involved in the excavation and stabilization of several historic sites in Arizona such as Tuzigoot, Montezuma Castle, Tonto National Monument, and Tumacacori.

**SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE:** This collection consists of photographs taken by Louis Caywood of several southern Arizona and northern Mexico missions, historical structures, and outdoor scenes. The missions and historic sites include: Caborca, Calabasas, Imuris, Tubutama, Oquitoa, Pitiquito, San Ignacio, and Tumacacori. Also included are photos of Easter related events, and several photographs of older photographs and drawings created by others.
