**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:** Ronald L. Ives was born in Cleveland, Ohio on October 12, 1909. His grandfather, Fredric Eugene Ives (1856-1937), and father, Herbert Eugene Ives (1882-1953), were noted scientists and inventors. Ronald Ives had two siblings, Kenneth and Barbara Ives. He attended schools in New Jersey and New York. From 1935-1937 he studied geology and geomorphology at the University of Colorado in Boulder, where he received Bachelor's and Master's degrees.

From 1937 to 1942, Ives worked in electronics and geology in Colorado, Texas, and California. He served in the United States Army from 1942-1946, where he took special courses in chemical and bacterial warfare, remote control gunnery and meteorology, electronics. He had a long time interest in military experiments, and he had security clearances of "secret" and "top secret" from 1942 to 1968.

Following World War II, Ives studied and taught at the University of Indiana in Bloomington. He received Master's and Doctoral degrees in geography there. His dissertation was entitled Chinook Winds in the Colorado High Plains Region.

Dr. Ives was a civilian instructor of electronics and remote control gunnery at Lowry Air Force Base in Colorado in 1950-1951. From 1951 through 1968, he worked as a researcher and engineer for various contractors to the federal government, including Cornell Aeronautical Laboratory; Tronicon, Inc.; John C. Bechman Co.; Bechman and Whitley, Inc.; Stanford Aerosol Laboratory; and Metronics Associates Inc.

Ives was an Assistant Professor of Geography at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff from 1968 to 1975. After his retirement, he pursued various personal and professional interests.

Beginning in the early 1930s, Ives contributed articles to scientific and scholarly journals. Two of his favorite topics were the history of the Spanish exploration of the American southwest,

and the geology of the Pinacate, a volcanic region along the Old Yuma Trail in northwestern Sonora, Mexico.

Ronald L. Ives, a bachelor throughout his life, died of natural causes on February 26, 1982. His ashes were scattered in the Pinacate region.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE: The collection consists of photographic prints, both in albums and loose, negatives, and slides, most taken by Ronald Ives, but some collected from other sources. Graphic materials created by Ives, including maps, charts, and diagrams, are also included. Ives was a dedicated photographer throughout his life. (Ives's earliest photos in the collection were taken when he was about 13 years old.) As a result, the photos document his varied activities in high school and college, research and recreational hiking in the Colorado mountains during his years at the University of Colorado and in Utah during his wartime service at Dugway Proving Ground, off-road exploring in the deserts of Arizona and Sonora, his many visits to Puerto Peñasco and the Pinacate region of Sonora, his interest in Father Eusebio Kino and missions founded by Kino, inventions and other projects in electronic and photographic equipment, as well as personal activities, friends, and vacation scenery.

Additional Ives photos and graphic materials are found in the AHS collection of Ives's papers (MS 0983), including oversized diagrams and maps (both prints and negatives) in Series VIII, and some original photo prints within unpublished manuscripts in the publications files, Series I and II.

## Series I: Photographic Prints, 1923-1980 and undated Subseries 1: Photo Albums (Numbered Prints), 1923-1977 and undated

Most of Ives's photos appear as numbered prints in these 30 albums. Ives numbered his photos, for the most part in chronological order but with some inconsistencies, beginning with his earliest 1923 photos. The prints are mounted in numerical order generally, but with exceptions. There are also a few unnumbered photos in the albums, apparently photos given to Ives by others. The albums include a caption for each photo.

Most of the photos in Albums 14-28 have become detached from the pages. To retain the order of the albums, loose photos are now kept in envelopes or plastic sleeves. Because these loose prints have become separated from the captions Ives included in the albums, this finding aid includes an appendix listing the captions for all photos in Albums 14-30. Ives often used abbreviations, especially for place names, in his captions. These have been spelled out whenever they could be identified.

#### Subseries 2: Unnumbered Prints, Captioned for Publication, 1940-1980

This subseries consists of photos Ives selected and captioned for publication. Ives published hundreds of articles and other writings, but this series includes incomplete sets of photos from only a small number of them. Ives used brief abbreviations to identify his publications, and several could not be identified. Although this subseries includes publications from 1940 to 1980, the photos included could have been taken in earlier years. An almost complete set of Ives's publications is located in the Ives Papers collection (MS 0983).

### Subseries 3: Unnumbered Prints by Subject, 1919-1979 and undated

This subseries includes a variety of photos roughly arranged by subject, but very few have any specific identification. Subjects are similar to those found in the numbered photos: Colorado mountains, Utah mountains and desert, Arizona and Sonora desert, and electronic and other scientific equipment. A small number of photos of Ives, his friends and family, are also included.

#### Subseries 4: Oversize Prints, 1940-1964 and undated

A few unnumbered prints from **Subseries 2 and 3**, that are too large to fit in the standard boxes, have been placed here for storage.

### Series II: Photographic Negatives, 1923-1977 and undated

### Subseries 1: Numbered Negatives (standard sizes), 1923-1977 and undated

Ives's main series of negatives, this series corresponds with the prints in Albums 1-30 (**Series I**, **Subseries 1**). Each negative is in a separate envelope, with Ives's notations of number, image title, and sometimes a listing of where and when the photo was published. A few envelopes contain multiple duplicate negatives.

The earliest negatives are nitrate, and as of 2016 no deterioration has been noted. The first safety negative seems to be number 2950 (from about 1934) but it was sometime later when Ives began to consistently use safety film. Some glass negatives are scattered throughout the collection, mainly used for infrared film. Glass negatives are found in number ranges 1000-1100s and 2900s, 3100s, 3800s, 4100s, 4300s, 4400s, 4800s, 5700s, 5800s.

#### Subseries 2: Special File Negatives (oversize), 1920s-1970s

Ives placed numbered negatives too large for his standard envelopes into what he called his "Special File." He left a card in the main negative file for each Special File negative. Aside from the size, these negatives are not "special" compared with others in the regular-sized file.

#### Subseries 3: Unnumbered Negatives, 1920s-1960s and undated

This subseries is a rather small group of negatives without numbers.

#### Series III: Slides, 1961-1977 and undated

The slides include subjects similar to the negatives and prints: Colorado mountains, deserts of Arizona and Sonora, Puerto Peñasco and Pinacate region of Sonora, missions founded by Father Eusebio Kino, and vacation pictures, especially of Yellowstone National Park. While it has been possible to reconstruct the original film rolls for most of the slides, only a few are dated and very few of the slides have specific identifications.
