- 13. If you were to move on to the next level of the NHD competition, what is one thing you would change or improve on your project?
- 14. What were the multiple perspectives you identified as you researched? How did these perspectives influence your project?
- 15. Looking back, what would you tell yourself if you could give yourself a piece of advice when you were beginning the NHD process?
- 16. If you had to give a piece of advice to a student who has never done NHD before, what would your advice be?
